Dear Mr. Krivosnak:

Receipt is acknowledged of the drawing attached to the form letter signed by you and forwarded to this Office, indicating that you desire the Greek Orthodox Cross inscribed on the headstone to be erected at the grave of your son, the late John Krivosnak, interred in the National Memorial Cemetery of The Pacific.

The official inscription on a government headstone includes either the Latin Cross for the Christian faith or the Star of David for the Hebrew or Jewish faith; or, if desired, the religious emblem may be omitted. The Greek Orthodox cross is not inscribed at government expense; however, it may be shown in lieu of the Latin Cross at private expense.

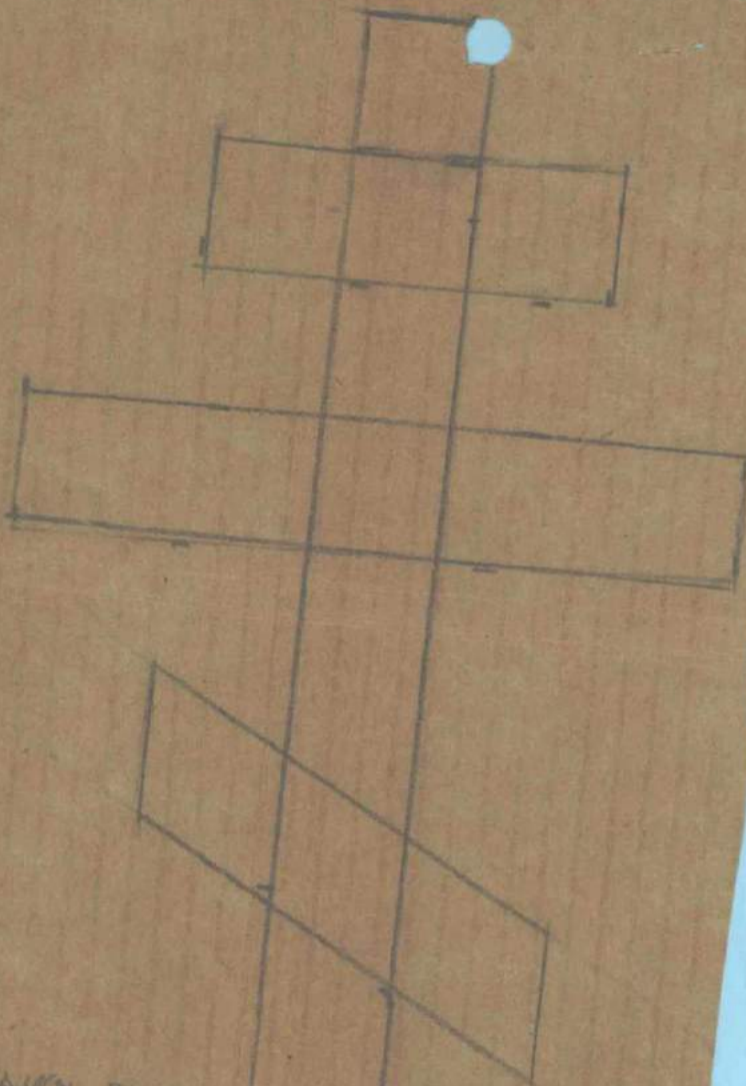
