"We are wondering if it would be possible for you to inform us about the approximate time of the return of our son's remains. We have been patiently waiting ever since June 9th, when his Co-Pilot, John Lake's remains were returned to Gaylord, Michigan. Our beloved Ed's grave was right beside his Co-Pilot's on Tinian.
